## What is this product?

### Туре

This is an investment fund established as a company with variable capital and segregated liability between sub-funds, incorporated with limited liability under the laws of Ireland.

### Objectives

**Investment objective** The investment objective of the Fund is to deliver real returns over the medium and longer term by investing in global equities, bonds, cash and derivatives. The target is to achieve a positive return on a rolling three-year basis. The Fund aims to achieve this by generating a return on a compound annualised basis exceeding the OECD G7 CPI plus 4% per annum.

**Investment policies** The Fund primarily invests in equities listed or traded on Recognised Exchanges. Investments may also be made in securities (including convertible bonds with equity linked notes which bonds shall be fixed and/or floating rate and shall generally be investment grade) which are listed or traded on a Recognised Exchange, subject to the Investment Restrictions within the Prospectus. The markets and exchanges invested in will be global and generally cover developed markets and economies, although investment may also be made in emerging markets. Investment in emerging markets is not likely to exceed 25% of the Fund's net assets.

Investments in the Fund may include financial derivative instruments. Such instruments may be used to obtain, increase or reduce exposure to underlying assets and may create leverage; therefore their use may result in greater fluctuations of the Net Asset Value of the Fund.

The Fund will invest both long and short and by doing so will employ leverage up to a maximum of 100% of Net Asset Value.

**Benchmark** The Fund is actively managed and whilst it is managed in reference to the benchmark: OECD G7 CPI plus 4%, the benchmark does not in any way constrain the management of the Fund. The Sub-Fund uses the OECD G7 CPI plus 4% for performance comparison reason only.

**Redemption and Dealing** You can buy, sell and switch shares of the Fund on demand on any Business Day as defined in the "Definitions" section of the Fund's Prospectus.

**Distribution Policy** It is intended that dividend income will be distributed as set out in the "Dividend Policy" section of the Supplement of the Fund.

Launch date The Fund was launched on 08/01/2010. The share class was funded on 07/11/2016.

**Fund Currency** The base currency of the Fund is GBP. This share class currency is USD.

Asset Segregation The Company is an umbrella fund with segregated liability between its sub-funds. The prospectus and the periodic reports are prepared for the Company as a whole.

### Intended retail investor

This product is intended for investors who plan to stay invested for at least 5 years and are prepared to take on a medium level of risk of loss to their original capital in order to get a higher potential return. It is designed to form part of a portfolio of investments.

### Term

The Fund is open-ended and has no maturity date. Subject to the liquidation, dissolution and termination rights of the board of the Fund as set forth in the Fund prospectus, the Fund cannot be automatically terminated. The PRIIP manufacturer, Waystone Management Company (IE) Limited, is not entitled to terminate the product unilaterally.

### Risks

## What happens if Waystone Management Company (IE) Limited is unable to pay out?
